Publication of pupils' work, photographs and Web Publication

There may be times when children are photographed as part of normal school activity and these photographs may be used for school or external publication.

Sometimes pupils' work may be published on the school website. Photographs that include your son or daughter may be published subject to the school rules that photographs will not clearly identify individuals and full names will not be used.

If you have concerns or if there is any legal reason why your child <u>should not be included</u> please advise us in the notes section below.

Permission to leave the school premises

We aim to provide your son / daughter with an outstanding curriculum experience. Most of this will be in the classroom, but there will be occasions when pupils benefit from learning away from the school site. For trips that are in close proximity to school (within walking distance), then our policy is **not** to seek parental permission for each of these trips. Instead, we ask for your permission at the start of the year for all such visits.

The following are examples of trips covered by such permission:

- A class trip that walks into Cawston during school hours
- We visit St Agnes Church for Harvest Festival and at Easter during school hours
- A class trip to the Church during school hours

Of course, we will ensure that such trips are suitably supervised by appropriate staff.

Sometimes pupils participate in school trips that involve:

- a significant journey
- an overnight stay
- anything unusual

When this is the case we will provide full details and require parental permission before your son / daughter can participate in the trip.
