

Pupil Premium Review 2011 -2016

The Government has allocated Pupil Premium funding to all schools to help raise attainment of pupils eligible for free school meals (FSM), Looked After Children (CLA) and children who have parents serving in the armed forces. This group of children has had consistently lower educational attainment than other children.

Cawston VC Primary Action Plan Priority:

To narrow the gap in attainment by adapting school provision to meet the needs of FSM pupils.

Success Criteria: Targeted strategies result in pupils, however financially disadvantaged, making improved progress leading to narrowing of attainment gaps.

2011-2012

The level of funding was £488 per eligible pupil.

Our school was allocated £8784 (18 FSM pupils).

We spent the allocation on developing the quality of provision.

The attainment gap between our FSM pupils and that of other pupils narrowed. In 2012 the performance of our FSM pupils improved and was close to or above that of our other pupils. The expenditure of our Pupil Premium funding had a positive impact on the educational attainment of those pupils for whom it was allocated.

Sept 2012 -2013

The level of funding was £600 per eligible pupil.

Our school allocation was £16713 (27 pupils). The funding was extended to pupils who had been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years.

We spent it on identifying effective provision for all FSM pupils.

The attainment gap between our FSM pupils and that of other pupils has narrowed. In 2013 the performance of our FSM pupils improved and was above that of our other pupils, except in progress in Mathematics.

The expenditure of our Pupil Premium funding has had a positive impact on the educational attainment of those pupils for whom it was allocated, with further focus for improvement on progress in mathematics.

Sept 2013 -2014

The level of funding is £900 per eligible pupil.

Our school allocation is £25,000 (27 pupils). The funding extends to pupils who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years.

We have planned to spend it on identifying effective provision for all FSM pupils, based on Sutton Trust research findings.

The attainment gap between our FSM pupils and that of other pupils has improved in maths. In 2014 the performance of our FSM pupils was above that of our other pupils nationally in Reading , Writing and Maths at L4+. The gap in writing was due to specific needs of pupils.

The expenditure of our Pupil Premium funding has had a positive impact on the educational attainment of those pupils for whom it was allocated, with further focus for improvement on the progress made by pupils in writing and mathematics.

Sept 2014 -2015

The level of funding is £1300 per eligible pupil.

Our school allocation is £36700 (28 pupils). The funding extends to pupils who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years. We have planned to spend it on identifying effective provision for all FSM pupils, based on Sutton Trust research findings. This year the support focused on giving pupils aspirational targets and on ensuring pupils use their writing and mathematics skills across the curriculum.

Sept 2015 -2016

In July 2015 the outcomes for our Pupil Premium pupils were above national and in line or above that of our other pupils. Our provision has been effective in closing the gap between Pupil Premium and other pupils. We plan to continue a similar funding allocation and review progress of pupils throughout the year to ensure we are meeting the needs of eligible pupils. Our aim is to improve the outcomes further and to increase the number of pupils making more than expected progress especially in mathematics.

The level of funding is £ per eligible pupil+ £300 per service child. Our school allocation is £52800 (pupils). The funding extends to pupils who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years.

We have planned to spend it on identifying effective provision for all FSM pupils, based on Sutton Trust research findings.
