

### English – The Iron Man

First published in 1968, this modern fairy tale has become a children's classic. The dramatic opening and memorable language instantly engages the reader. It tells the story of a mysterious iron giant whose destructive quest for food alarms the local farming community. The story is told through the eyes of a young boy who forms a friendship with Iron Man. In time, Iron Man goes from villain to hero. Children will write non-fiction texts based on fictional experiences and explore being adventure writers.

### Languages – Spanish & Signing

Children will carry on learning Spanish. In addition they will be using the British Sign language, learning why such a language exists and how to communicate basic greetings.

### Science – States of Matter

Children will learn about the differences between solids, liquids and gases, classifying objects and identifying their properties. The children will work scientifically and collaboratively to investigate the weight of a gas. Furthermore, they will have chance to find the ideal temperature to melt chocolate. They will explore in-depth how water changes state, exploring melting, freezing, condensing as well as a particular focus on evaporation.

### History – Saxons and Vikings

Children will learn all about the raids and invasions by vikings and Anglo-Saxon Britain. They will learn about significant events and order these chronologically on a timeline as well as learning all about everyday life.

The children will find out about Anglo-Saxon Kings who ruled during the 'Viking Age' and examine their influence in British history. In addition, they will learn about the Anglo-Saxon justice system and compare and contrast crimes, punishments and laws.

### Smashing Saxons & Vicious Vikings

### Music – Stop

Using the song 'Stop' by Joanna Mangona, children will begin by listening and appraising and eventually performing it by singing and playing instruments.

### PE – Swimming & Dance

Alongside REAL PE, children will be learning dance. Beginning with 3 easy dance moves children will explore how to use their bodies to the music Mama Mia. Swimming will continue 27/2, 12/3 & 26/3.

### Art & Design – Salvador Dali

Building upon the idea that meeting and forming a friendship with an iron man, children will embark on a 'surrealist' journey looking and recreating the works of Dali.

### Computing – Coding

'Scratch' is a programming language which children can use to program media such as stories, games and animation.

As children create with 'Scratch', they learn to think creatively, work collaboratively and reason systematically.

### RE – Philosophy Salvation

In RE, children will be exploring the word 'salvation' and to do this they will be discussing and debating the question: What does sacrifice mean? They will compare different religions and learn about Easter & Lent.
