### **SEPTEMBER 2020 GOVERNMENT GUIDANCE and SCHOOL PLANNING**

At the time of writing we share the government's ambition to open all classes in September for all pupils. We understand that this may involve some adaptations to the school day, which we will be able to plan when we know more details. For social distancing measures our 'Bubble School' has staggered start /end times, staggered playtimes, discreet play areas for groups and lunchtime in class rooms. This may need to continue in September. Having whole classes in school will mean that 2 children will be sharing a desk so the 1+m rule will not be possible within classes. We can keep each class apart during the day with logistics planning for movements around school. We await further guidance and will respond to any developments over the summer. We will keep you informed with any updates as soon as possible.

As always, our priority will be the health and safety of pupils, families and staff. We are acutely aware that children will need time to settle back to school routines. Our focus will be on well-being, picking up any learning gaps and embedding positive attitudes with a 'Recovery Curriculum', which is being implemented in all schools across the country.
