

Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator within one whole.

Geometry

To revise angles. To identify perpendicular lines and identify and explain parallel lines. To describe and draw 2D shapes based on their properties.

Measures/Time 12-hour & 24-hour clocks

Record and compare time in terms of seconds, minutes, hours. Use vocabulary such as o'clock, am/pm, morning, afternoon, noon and midnight.
