Children should not wear jewellery to school, except stud earrings for pieced ears. Earrings are to be removed for PE and swimming. If your child is unable to do this independently then please remove them on the morning they do PE/Swimming.

Long hair MUST be tied back for school. We do not allow fashion haircuts, shaves, colours or styles.

We are suggesting the children dress up as animals from different countries and continents they have studied this year:


Sycamore: Woodland animals of the UK,

Parking on School Site

Car parking at the beginning and end of the school day is a problem at most primary schools. Children and parents arrive and depart in a relatively short period of time and this causes congestion. Parking on the school site is only available to staff and official visitors to the school. A permit may be issued to parents with a legitimate and demonstrable need for this facility, such as a registered disability. There is also no pedestrian access at the front entrance to the school, this is a roadway and dangerous for children.

Please remember:

- No parents' vehicles may access the school grounds between 8.30 and 9.10 am and between 3.00 and 3.30pm.
- No parking immediately outside the school gates.
- No parking or vehicle movements on the pavements of Howards Way.
- Please observe parking restrictions in Jubilee Close.
- Please do not obstruct or park in front of driveways. Respect our neighbours who live close to the school.
