

Please see below the DfE Guidance on voluntary Lateral Flow Device (LFD) Testing for households.

We understand that the DfE will be producing letters to help publicise the lateral flow home testing offer but in the mean-time we can share the links about the rapid lateral flow home test kits which are now available for:

Testing for Primary and Secondary school staff, as well as high school students, is covered by existing current arrangements. Primary school pupils will not be asked to test at this time.

NHS Test and Trace announced earlier this week, that all adults in households with school and college age children without symptoms can now access regular rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. Undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing helps reduce transmission of the virus. Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles.

Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are <u>different ways</u> for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- through your employer, if they offer testing to employees
- by collecting a home test kit from a local test site anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests
- by ordering a home test kit online please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most

We know some of the options for collecting the tests in person within Norfolk are limited but there are also links that enable you to order kits online for home delivery:
